Covid –19 Modifications

» Sanitization

- Sanitize bathroom and high-touch surfaces (door knobs, keypads, light switches, etc.) children's desks and chairs after school each day.
- Desk Sanitization—Sanitization of teachers desks is the responsibility of the teacher.
- Hand Sanitizer Hand sanitizer will be available in all classrooms, the kitchen and at the main door.
- Sanitizing wipes will be available to teachers and students for cleaning purposes throughout the day.

» Personal/Individual Protocol

- Any type of face covering is not required by staff, students or parents of students.
- Students and staff are encouraged to wash hands thoroughly.
- Covid-19 vaccinations are not required for staff and students.
- » Social Events & School Outings
 - CPS will return to its normal operating procedures for social events and school outings. Special events open to parents and families will also resume.

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Home Quarantine Requirements

	Scenario Description Followed by Cornerstone Preparatory School For Therapeutic Education
	<u>Please note</u> : CPS considers persons who have either had Covid-19 or who are vaccinated as having immunity. Persons who have not had the vaccine or have proof of infection are considered "susceptible".
	"Previously Infected" refers to a person who has previously been infected with Covid-19. This person will be asked to furnish proof of a positive Covid-19 test result or antibody testing. Vaccinated persons will also be asked to provide proof of vaccination.
Scenario 1a (Exposure - Unvaccinated or Not Previously Infected)	 An unvaccinated or not previously infected student or staff member has been exposed to a person with confirmed Covid-19 within their household. Student/staff member will be sent home, if not home already Quarantine at home for 14 days after the date of last exposure to the Covid-19 positive contact. If additional household members become ill with Covid-19, or if the exposed person cannot avoid continued close contact, the length of quarantine may be >14 days. Or, the exposed student may produce a negative Covid-19 test, 5 days after the positive test date of the household member. If an exposed person becomes ill during quarantine, see Scenario 3.
Scenario 1b (Exposure - Vaccinated or Previously Infected)	 A fully vaccinated* or previously infected student or staff member has been exposed to a person with confirmed Covid-19 within their household. Students and staff that are fully vaccinated or have been previously infected that do not elicit any Covid-19 symptoms are NOT required to quarantine. *14 days after the completion of the Covid-19 vaccination series. Exposed student/staff must be monitored for symptoms for 14 days after the exposure. If an exposed student/staff develops symptoms see Scenario 3.

Scenario 2a (Exposure - Unvaccinated or Not Previously Infected)	 An unvaccinated student has been exposed to a person with confirmed Covid-19 outside of their household. Student/staff will be sent home (if not home already). Quarantine at home for 14 days after the date of last exposure to the Covid-19 positive contact or produce a negative Covid-19 test result. Test cannot be taken before the 5th day after the date of the last exposure. If an exposed person develops Covid-19 symptoms during quarantine, see Scenario 3. If household members were not exposed to the person with confirmed Covid-19; they may continue school attendance if the exposed sibling remains healthy.
Scenario 2b (Exposure - Vaccinated or Previously Infected)	 A fully vaccinated or previously infected student/staff member has been exposed to a person with confirmed Covid-19 outside of their household. Students and staff that are fully vaccinated or who have previously been infected that do not elicit any Covid-19 symptoms are NOT required to quarantine. *14 days after the completion of the Covid-19 vaccination series. Exposed student or staff member must be monitored for symptoms for 14 days after the exposure. If an exposed student or staff member develops symptoms see Scenario 3.
Scenario 3 (Symptoms)	 A student or staff member becomes ill with Covid-19 symptoms, such as: fever/chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting or diarrhea. Student or staff will be isolated and will be sent home if not already home. Quarantine at home for 14 days after the onset of symptoms or produce a negative rapid test result. Individual must be fever free for at least 24 hours without the use of medication If the ill person has a positive Covid-19 viral test, see Scenario 4.
Scenario 4 (Covid-19 Positive)	 A student or staff member has a positive Covid-19 viral test. Student or staff member will be sent home, if not already at home/isolated. Isolate at home for 10 days after the positive test date or produce a negative rapid test result after the 5th day after the positive test date. Individual must be fever free for at least 24 hours without the use of medication.
